DIVISION CHAMPIONS AND AWARDS

Each Division will have a Champion and a Reserve.Points: $1^{st} - 10; 2^{nd} - 9; 3^{rd} - 8; 4^{th} - 7; 5^{th} - 6; 6^{th} - 5; 7^{th} - 4; 8^{th} - 3; 9^{th} - 2; 10^{th} - 1$ Ribbons: 1^{st} through 5^{th}

Awards for Champion and Reserve in each Division.

MUST RIDE ALL CLASSES WITH SAME HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION IN THE DIVISION TO QUALIFY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Parking: One parking pass will be issued per Exhibitor. **Parking will only be allowed on the east side of Barn #5, near the Mule Days Office. Parking is prohibited in any other area of the fairgrounds in the stable area. Violators will be towed at the owner's expense.** A parking pass, with Exhibitor's name and phone number, must be clearly displayed on the dashboard.

THE EASTERN SIERRA TRI-COUNTY FAIR HORSE SHOW WILL OPERATE UNDER THE AQHA AND NRHA RULE BOOKS BUT WILL NOT CIRCUMVENT THE STATE RULES. A COPY OF THE WESTERN REINING, VERSATILITY RANCH HORSE AND ENGLISH RULES WILL BE IN THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE. THEY ARE ALSO AVAILABLE ONLINE AT THE AQHA AND NRHA WEBSITES.

- 1. The Eastern Sierra Tri-County Fair Horse Show is open to all exhibitors with no limitations as to city, county, or state of residence.
- 2. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to excuse a horse or rider. The decision of the Horse Show Committee is final.
- 3. Horse Show entry fees are non-refundable for scratched classes. Refunds and substitutions will only be issued with verification from a Veterinarian or Physician of injury to horse or rider. Substitutions will be allowed subject to review and approval of the Horse Show Committee. No refund for scratched classes on the day of the class. ALL SCRATCHES AND/OR ADDS MUST BE MADE BY 4:00 PM THE DAY BEFORE THE CLASS IS HELD.

- 4. Show will follow AQHA and NRHA rules if those rules do not conflict with California State Rules, Department of Agriculture Fairs and Expositions.
- 5. Age of Junior is considered as of January 1 of the current show year. NO CROSS-ENTRIES AMONG LEAD LINE, WALK/TROT/JOG, AND OTHER CLASSES. NO YOUTH OR AMATEUR SHALL ENTER ONE ANIMAL IN CANTER CLASSES AND THEN RIDE IN A WALK/TROT CLASS WITH ANOTHER ANIMAL. ONCE YOU HAVE CANTERED YOU MAY NOT ENTER A WALK/JOG CLASS UNLESS YOU ARE A TRAINER.
- 6. Exhibitors in Lead Line classes must be accompanied by a responsible adult, 18 yrs and older.
- 7. ALL EXHIBITORS SHOWING OVER FENCES MUST WEAR A USEF-APPROVED HELMET AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED. ALL JUNIOR EXHIBITORS SHOWING ENGLISH, WESTERN, REINING, TRAIL OR RANCH HORSE MUST WEAR A USEF-APPROVED HELMET AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED.
- 8. BAREBACK RIDING IS PROHIBITED.
- 9. No one under the age of 18 yrs may show a stallion.
- 10. Work in all classes is at the discretion of the Judge. The Judge's decisions are final.
- 11. Schooling in any class is prohibited.
- 12. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to excuse a horse or rider. The Horse Show Committee's decision is final.
- 13. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to know when their class starts and be ready to enter the ring. There will be a 2-minute gate call for any Exhibitor not at the gate, then the gate will be closed. If there is a conflict, please let the back gate know so they can change your order of go when possible.
- 14. Hunt coats are required to be worn in all English classes unless the Judge decides otherwise.
- 15. All courses and patterns may be picked up at the Horse Show Office the morning of the class and will be posted outside the Horse Show Office 1 hour before classes start.
- 16. POST ENTRIES will NOT be accepted but classes can be added 24 hours prior to the date and time of the class in the Horse Show Office. **NO POST ENTRIES TO ANY RANCH VERSATILITY CLASS.**
- 17. Stalls: \$75.00 for 5 nights. Arrival time Wednesday, August 28, 2024, after NOON. Departure time Monday, September 2, 2024, by 10:00 AM. Feed and shavings are not included. Shavings may be bought on site on Wednesday, August 28, 2024, no earlier than NOON. Single night stall fee is \$25.00 each night. A tack room is \$30.00 for 5 nights, arriving Wednesday, August 28, 2024, after NOON. Departure time Monday, September 2, 2024, by 10:00 AM.

STALLS WILL BE ASSIGNED BY THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE AND ARE NOT TO BE CHANGED WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE.

STALLS MUST BE CLEANED BEFORE DEPARTURE OR A FEE WILL ACCRUE.

- 18. Cross-entering is not allowed between a Lead Line or Walk/Trot/Jog Exhibitor and any other class at this show. Cross-entering is not allowed between Cross Rail Exhibitors and any other Over Fences classes at this show except Hunter Hack.
- 19. A horse/mule may not be entered in two different age-break divisions with the same rider; example: 12 yrs & under and 13-17 yrs.
- 20. <u>Amateur Definition</u>: Any person who has not directly shown, trained, given lessons or assisted a spouse or immediate family member in the training of a horse/mule for remuneration in the five (5) previous years, and has not held credentials of a horse show judge for any organization.
- 21. Any Exhibitor who is competing as an Amateur must complete and turn into the Horse Show Office an Amateur Declaration.

- 22. Exhibitors may show more than one horse/mule in classes that are judged independently (over fences, trail & reining [versatility]) where the horse is judged and not the rider (equitation).
- 23. In classes where prize money is distributed the horse/mule owner must have their Social Security number on the entry blank or prize money will not be distributed.
- 24. ANY EXHIBITOR WHO IS SHOWING DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR AND/OR IS NOT WEARING PROPER ATTIRE WILL BE DQ'D AND ALL POINTS WILL BE LOST, AND THEY WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE PREMISES.
- 25. NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS AT ANY TIME DURING THE HORSE SHOW.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

English Classes:

- <u>Hunter Classes</u>: To be shown over a course of at least eight (8) fences with at least one (1) change of lead. Judged on performance, manners, way of going and soundness. Martingales may be worn in Over Fences classes.
- <u>Hunter Hack</u>: To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter in both directions of the ring and hand gallop; to back up easily and stand quietly. No more than six (6) entries to gallop at one time. Any or all entries may be required to jump. Martingales may not be worn.
- <u>Hunt Seat Equitation</u>: Riders should have a workmanlike appearance, seat, and light and supple hands, conveying the impression of complete control should any emergency arise. **Over Fences**: Each Exhibitor may circle once before approaching the first obstacle then proceed around the course keeping an even pace throughout.
- <u>Hunter Under Saddle:</u> Horses are judged on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter. Emphasis is placed on smoothness of gait, free-flowing stride, and willingness to perform.
- **English Pleasure:** To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter in both directions of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint.

Western Classes:

In Western Divisions animals under 5 yrs may show in a snaffle bit or hackamore and the rider must use two hands on the reins. Animals 6 yrs and over must be shown in a bridle with one hand on the reins. Animals shown in a bridle must use a standard western bit with maximum length no longer than 8" and a port no higher than 3-1/2". Joined mouthpieces are acceptable. **No mechanical hackamores. No "bitless" bridles.**

- Western Pleasure: To be shown at a flat-footed walk, free moving, easy riding, two-beat jog and three-beat lope in both directions of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Horses may be asked to back up. Extended gaits may be called for by the Judge. Entries shall be penalized for being on the wrong lead.
- Western Riding: Judges the ability of the horse to change leads precisely, easily, and simultaneously, using both hind and forelegs. Must follow one of four patterns consisting of a log and a series of pylons and must change gaits from a walk to a jog or lope throughout the pattern. Credit is given to the horse that changes fluidly and precisely between the middle of the pylons within the pattern.

- <u>Western Equitation</u>: Riders to be judged on seat, hand, performance of the horse, appearance of horse and rider, and suitability of horse to rider. To be shown at a walk, jog, and lope in both directions of the ring.
- <u>Western Horsemanship</u>: This is designed to test the horsemanship abilities of youth and amateur riders using western tack. Divided into sections, riders follow a prescribed pattern of maneuvers at a walk, trot, or lope.
- <u>Trail Horse:</u> Trail horses are required to work over and through obstacles. No horse may enter the trail course area until the course and Judge are ready. Riders will be able to inspect the course on foot for 15 minutes prior to the start of the class. This class is judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response to the rider, and quality of movement. Credit will be given to the horse's negotiation of the obstacles with style and efficiency.
- <u>Green Horse:</u> Horses in their first year of showing or that have shown during previous years in any recognized equine association in any Western classes, but have not won 25 points or more, or a World or Reserve World Championship, or a bronze horse medal in EWU (Erste Westernreiter Union) as of January 1 of the current show year. Points from all divisions (except Walk-Trot) will count and are cumulative in determining eligibility. In addition, as of January 1 of the current show year, horses may not have won \$2,500 or more in lifetime earnings under saddle in any Western class at any event in which the earnings are verifiable. Accuracy of eligibility is the responsibility of the owner and exhibitor and is subject to verification. A Green horse may be ridden in a shank bit or two-handed in a snaffle or bosal.
- <u>Halter Class</u>: First and foremost, a balanced, as well as structurally correct, attractive, high quality, and wellmuscled horse. This horse should be symmetrical from head to tail, with eye appeal that is a result of the blending of an attractive head; refined throat latch; well-proportioned, trim neck; long sloping shoulder; deep heart girth; short, strong back; long hip and croup. These characteristics should be coupled with straight, structurally correct legs and feet that are free of major deviation. The ideal horse should appear athletic and be uniformly well-muscled throughout with a well-defined and muscular forearm, chest, shoulder, stifle, and gaskin.

The above descriptions are for general information only. For detailed information please refer to the 2022 AQHA Rule Book.

Reining Classes:

To rein a horse is not only to guide him, but also to control his every movement. The best reined horse should be willingly guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance indicated to comply. Any movement on his own must be considered a lack of, or temporary loss of, control.

Open: Any horse ridden by any rider. Points are earned by the horse.

- <u>Amateur:</u> An amateur shall be defined as any person who has not directly shown, trained, given lessons, or assisted a spouse or immediate family in the training of a horse for remuneration in the five (5) previous calendar years. Points are earned by the horse/rider combination.
- Youth: A class for youth 17 yrs and under. Age of youth is considered as of January 1 of the current show year. Youth may ride any horse. Points are earned by the horse/rider combination. A helmet is required.

Versatility Ranch Horse:

The Versatility Ranch Horse Division demonstrates the performance versatility and conformation of the working ranch horse. Exhibitors may show up to four (4) horses. Four (4) categories will be held:

Category I:	Ranch Riding, Ranch Trail
Category II:	Ranch Reining
Category III:	Ranch Cutting, Ranch Cow Working
Category IV:	Ranch Conformation

Because this is a non-rated show, we allow cross-entering into other western classes. (If this show was rated cross-entering would not be allowed.)

- **Class Participation:** No horse less than 3 yrs of age may exhibit. No hoof polish. No braided or banded manes/tails or tail extensions. Trimming inside ears is discouraged. Trimming bridle paths is allowed. Fetlocks or excessive or long facial hair is allowed. Equipment with silver should not count over a good working outfit. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged. Holding the saddle horn with either hand will not be penalized in any class. Posting at a trot is acceptable.
- Ranch Riding: Horses shall be shown individually, and the class may be held inside or outside of an arena. The Ranch Riding Class measures the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from one ranch task to another.
- Ranch Trail: The ranch trail class should test the horse's ability to cope with situations encountered in everyday riding.
- Ranch Reining: The ranch reining class measures the ability of the stock horse to perform basic handling maneuvers.
- Ranch Cow Work: The ideal stock horse must also be a cow horse and this class demonstrates and measures the horse's ability to do cow work.
- **Ranch Cutting:** This class is judged on the ability of the horse to work a cow by separating it from the herd and holding it to demonstrate the horse's ability to work the cow.
- **Ranch Conformation:** The purpose of ranch conformation is to preserve the American Quarter Horse type by selecting well-mannered individuals in order of the resemblance to the breed ideal.
